Click Menu, then the **Library Media Center** Tab, scroll down, click “**Library Catalog and Databases**” on the left side of page.

When researching the topic first determine if your topic falls into either American or World history.

- If American history use American History Online
- If World history use Modern World History Online (this can also be used for American History)

I – American History Online: Inside the database, after searching, narrow your results to “Images” after finding articles.

II – Modern World History Online: Inside the database, after searching, narrow your results to “Images” after finding articles.

Username: edmondschools **Password:** facts

III - Gale Virtual Reference Library: Inside the database, this database will not have images, but will have almost ALL of the topics!

Password: bulldogs

IV- Salem History Online: This database will not have images, but it too will have most topics. Sign in by typing the password in the field on the left.

Password: memorial

V - SIRS Researcher/SIRS Government: Inside the database, after searching, narrow your results to “Graphics/Multimedia”.

Username: edmondmemorial **Password:** 73013

IV – Metro Library

A - New York Times

- Click the link to the Metropolitan Library System
- Click “Research”
- In the Search Bar (midway down the page) type “New York”, hit enter
- Click “Visit Database” under “New York Times”
- Use the Search button in top left hand corner, limit results to “Image” bottom left hand corner.

B - African American History Online – database specific to the history of African Americans

C - American Indian History Online – database specific to the history of American Indians

D - Latino American Experience – database specific to the history of Latin Americans

E - Historical (ProQuest) Newspapers – database containing original newspaper articles spanning 1851 to 2010.

F - Issues & Controversies in American History – database contains very complete articles chronicling controversial issues from American History.

G- U.S. History in Context – database containing range of articles from American history.

H- World History in Context – database containing range of articles from world history.

Citation Samples for Databases

The following is the basic format for an article from an online database. The citation can usually be found at the bottom of the article or by clicking the “citation” button. :o)

Author. “Article Title.” *Journal Title* Date: pages. *Title of Database*. Medium of publication consulted (Web). Date of access.

MLA Citation for Digital Files (Images) - Include the artist's name. Give the title of the artwork in italics. Provide the date of composition. If the date of composition is unknown, place the abbreviation *n.d.* in place of the date. Name the medium of the piece, and finally,

provide the name of the institution that houses the artwork followed by the location of the institution. End the entry with the name of the digital format (e.g., PDF, JPEG file, *Microsoft Word* file, MP3). If the work does not follow traditional parameters for citation, give the author's name, the name of the work, the date of creation, and the medium of publication. Use *Digital file* when the medium cannot be determined. (Taken from Perdue Owl website www.owl.english.perdue.edu)
